ENGLISH (ENG)

Subject Name	English
Course outline	In 2024, Queensland schools, including Springwood High School, will plan, teach, assess and report on English in Years 7, 8, 9 and 10 using the Australian Curriculum. English is organised into three interrelated strands that support students' growing understanding and use of Standard Australian English. Together the three strands focus on developing students' knowledge, understanding and skills in listening, reading, viewing, speaking and writing.
	 The three strands are: Language: knowing about the English language, Literature: understanding, appreciating, responding to, analysing and <u>creating</u> literature, Literacy: expanding the repertoire of English usage.
	During Term 2, all Year 9 students sit the NAPLAN assessment. NAPLAN preparation is done throughout Terms 1 and 2.
Assessment	6 pieces of assessment – 4 written and 2 spoken.
Required equipment	128 pages A4 exercise book (covered), writing materials, USB, ruler.
Excursions and/or subject costs	One per semester if suitable opportunities arise.
Any further information	HOMEWORK Students will be required to complete class activities and homework pieces to facilitate the development of their capacity to use language in its various modes (speaking, listening, reading, viewing and writing) and their understanding of and knowledge about language, including its use in literature and mass media.

MATHEMATICS (MAT)

Subject Name	Mathematics
Course outline	In 2024, the Australian National Curriculum will be followed in Mathematics.
	 The three content strands are: Statistics and Probability, Measurement and Geometry, Number and Algebra.
Assessment	Written tests and assignments.
	All Year 9 students are expected to bring a scientific calculator to class. These are readily available from retail outlets.
Required equipment	Students are expected to bring an exercise book, ruler, pen/pencils, their text book and calculator to each lesson.
	If other items are required, students will be notified or the items will be provided by the Mathematics Department.
	Each Year 9 student is given a textbook with access online for use at home. Homework is given regularly from a combination of board work, sheets and text books. Regular completion of homework is expected.
Any further information	During Term 2, all Year 9 students sit the NAPLAN assessment. The NAPLAN numeracy tests are taken in two parts including a calculator and a non-calculator test. Preparation is done throughout Terms 1 and 2.
	All students will have the opportunity to use Education Perfect online in class and at home. Usernames and passwords will be issued in Term 1 for the year.

SCIENCE (SCI)

Subject Name	Science
Course outline	Year 9 Science follows the Australian Curriculum which aims to ensure that students develop an interest in Science as a means of expanding their curiosity and willingness to explore, ask questions and hypothesise on the world in which they live. In Year 9, students will study a range of topics from each of the four discipline areas; Biology, Chemistry, Physics and Earth Science. Students will be assessed through three interrelated strands; Science understanding, Science as a human endeavour and Science inquiry skills.
	 Students will learn about the following topics: Science is investigating Light and sound Living with microbes Inside the atom Electrical energy Everyday reactions Body balance Using electricity Ecosystems Dynamic Earth
Assessment	Tests, research assignments, student experimental investigations and a collection of work comprise the year's assessment folio.
Any further information	Textbook: 'ScienceWorld 9' is available for students to hire from the library and as well as in electronic form. Homework: students are required to prepare and complete class activities, assignments, projects and study for tests.

HISTORY (HIS)

Subject Name	History
Course outline	In 2024, students will engage with the units of the Australian National Curriculum. This learning area focusses on the study of History. Units of learning have a historical and contemporary focus, from personal to global contexts, and consider challenges for the future.
	Through studying History, students develop the ability to question, think critically, solve problems, communicate effectively, make decisions and adapt to change. Thinking about and responding to issues requires an understanding of the key historical, geographical, political, economic and societal factors involved, and how these different factors interrelate.
	Units include:
	 Australia – The Making of a Nation World War One World War Two.
Assessment	Research assignments and written tests.
Required equipment	Folio, 128 page notebook, writing materials, colour pencils.
Excursions and/or subject costs	One per semester if suitable opportunities arise.

Subject Name	Health and Physical Education
Course outline	Health and Physical Education allows students, through flexible ability grouping, to develop the physical skills, knowledge and understanding that will allow them to lead healthy and active lives. Students will study a wide range of physical activities focusing on skill development, game play strategies, game practice and fitness sessions.
	Practical Units: - challenge and adventure activities - games and sports - lifelong physical activities - rhythmic and expressive movement activities. Students will participate in practical units from the above dependent on availability of facilities.

Subject Name	DANCE
Course outline	Students who select Dance as one of their electives will engage in an exciting course of study including the exploration of: • Music • Media • Dance • Drama
	The course is structured so that either students are able to elect to explore all 4 strands of the Performing Arts (Music, Media, Dance and Drama) by adopting a multi-disciplinary approach to the subject <u>OR</u> they may choose to explore one particular strand about which they are passionate. Classes based on one strand of the Arts (eg. drama or dance) are determined by student interest as indicated on the Subject Preference form. The skills students learn in Performing Arts will help prepare them for many pathways.
	Performing Arts encourages the development of: creative, critical and imaginative thinking; oral communication; disciplined working and self-motivation; the ability to work alone or in groups.
Assessment	Students will be assessed across the Making and Responding dimensions of The Arts. Assessment tasks may be negotiated with the teacher and will be strand specific.
Required equipment	Exercise book/folder. Students may be required to bring comfortable workshop clothes e.g. leggings, tracksuit pants.
Excursions and/or subject costs	Nil subject cost. Students may be offered the chance to view one Arts Council performance during the year. The cost of the performance will be approximately \$15.00.

Subject Name	Fashion Studies
Course outline	Year 9 Fashion Studies is designed as an introduction to the Fashion curriculum. Students will develop confidence and proficiency in their sewing and design skills to enhance their Senior studies. Students will use their imaginations to create, innovate and express themselves and their ideas, through designing and producing a number of themed fashion items.
	What will students learn?
	By engaging in Fashion Studies, students will learn about:
	- Key sewing and design skills;
	- The properties and performances of textiles
	- The role of fashion in society
	Units include:
	 An introduction to basic sewing (creating a zipped pencil case or bag)
	Dying techniques – creating a patchwork cushion
	 Upcycling existing garments through embroidery and embellishment
	 Jingle bells – designing and producing a Christmas themed fashion item
Assessment	Students will be assessed through a variety of methods including: Knowledge exams, sewing proficiency, design projects/product and folio work.
Required equipment	Folio (A3 or A4 art/sketch book) and drawing and colouring pencils and pens, USB.

Subject Name	Hospitality (Food Technology)
Course outline	In Year 9, Hospitality students will have the opportunity to build on the design skills combined with practical cookery skills to produce solutions focused on food preparation.
	This program will continue to build on the basic knowledge and skills learnt in Year 8 – including topics of:
	 health and safety procedures in the kitchen food preparation techniques, food presentation techniques
	 care and use of food preparation equipment environmental sustainability cultural influences on Australian foods.
	Students will work both independently and collaboratively in this subject.
Assessment	Students will be assessed through a variety of methods including exams, practical cookery and design folios.
Required equipment	Take home container for weekly cookery and exercise book.

HEALTH & PHYSICAL EDUCATION EXTENSION (HPX)

Subject Name	HPE Extension AFL and Athletics
Course outline	HPE Extension allows students, through flexible ability grouping, to develop the physical skills, knowledge and understanding that will allow them to lead healthy and active lives. Students will focus their studies on AFL and Athletics skill development, game play and competition strategies, game and event practice and fitness sessions.
	The theoretical component of the course will expose students to diet and nutrition, training principles, biomechanics and sports psychology. Students will also learn officiating and umpiring skills of AFL and Athletics. All students electing HPE Extension will be assessed on both practical and theoretical components of the course.
	Students will be required to participate in the following Sports:
	 Athletics AFL Possible other sports that students could participate in:
	 Basketball/Netball, Volleyball. Swimming
	The HPE Extension Program focuses on skill development, game play strategies, game and competition practice, fitness and technique sessions in specific sports. The course also provides preparation for teams to participate in competitions throughout the year.
	The theoretical component of this course offers students the opportunity to enhance their knowledge of the sport and gain qualifications that may lead to employment opportunities. To this end, students may participate in courses such as Level 0 Coaching and Level 1 Umpiring/officiating in their chosen sport.
	Students wishing to join the HPE Extension program may be required to meet with the Head of Department for Health and Physical Education for a suitability interview. Places in the HPE Extension program are capped.

Subject Name	Japanese
Course outline	Year 9 Japanese builds on the skills and knowledge developed in Year 7 and 8 and continues to focus on the development of the four language skills; speaking, reading, listening and writing. Students in Year 9 Japanese will study a variety of topics including school life in Japan, holidays in Japan and locations and directions.
	Students studying Japanese will be given the opportunity to interact with students from Japan as part of our study tour program and may be able to participate in cultural excursions and experiences throughout the year. Year 9 students may be invited to take part in a cultural exchange visit to Japan if the opportunity arises.
	This subject is recommended for students who enjoyed or experienced success in Year 8 Japanese.
Assessment	Combination of assignments and exams focusing on all four language skills.
Required equipment	Notebook, writing equipment and display book.
